Public Meeting Scheduled for Nov. 13 in Savannah to Discuss Revised Manual for Erosion and Sediment Control in Georgia

ATHENS, Ga. – The Georgia Soil and Water Conservation Commission is holding a public meeting in Savannah to present what has changed in the revised Manual for Erosion and Sediment Control in Georgia (also known as the "Green Book" or "Design Manual") and explain new procedures for accepting new practices into the Manual.

The Erosion and Sediment Control Program was set up to improve and protect Georgia's urban soil and water resources by reducing the amount of erosion from urban development sites. The program does this through the use of best management practices (BMPs) as called for in the soil and water conservation districts law and delivered through soil and water conservation districts.

Prior to this meeting, GSWCC held public meetings in Columbus and Cartersville, Ga. A meeting on this same topic has been scheduled for Nov. 18 in Atlanta.
