Free Small Farms Opportunity Workshop on Sapelo Island, Jan. 23

STATESBORO, **Ga.** – A free workshop for small scale farmers and anyone interested in starting a small agricultural operation will be held at the Sapelo Island National Estuarine Research Reserve Long Tabby Educational Lab on Jan. 23, 2014, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

Attendees will learn about financial assistance provided by USDA agencies to small agricultural producers, as well as receiving expert advice on rural development issues, irrigation basics, and other technical matters. In the afternoon, a field trip of SINERR has been scheduled for the attendees.
