His legacy is one of forward thinking while reflecting and educating on the district and county's history. Roger was named Georgia Conservation District Supervisor of the Year in 2016 and inducted into the Georgia Association of Conservation Districts Hall of Fame in 2018. He was inducted into the National Association of Conservation District's Southeast Region Hall of Fame in 2021. Roger is also a GACD Board Member Emeritus

and formerly served as GACD Vice President. Roger's father, Roger O. Bowman, Sr. was one of the 5 founding members of the Catoosa County Conservation District, which was founded on October 3, 1951.

Roger grew up working on his family's 350-acre farm in Catoosa County where they grew vegetables for distribution to wholesalers in GA and TN as well as a 500 head farrow to finish commercial swine operation. In his youth, Roger participated in 4-H with a focus on row crops, forestry, livestock production and land judging. Growing up, Roger helped his father install terraces and maintain drainage systems on the farm, resulting in a firsthand education in conservation practices. In high school, he worked as a summer intern with the Soil Conservation Service (now the Natural Resources Conservation Service) doing survey work and cropland measurement. These experiences, along with his work for the Tennessee Valley Authority's Natural Resources Conservation Program, solidified his interest in natural resource conservation.

Roger graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Economics from the University of Georgia and a Master of Business Administration from Vanderbilt University. He and his wife, Kay, live on a family farm in Ringgold that has been in operation since 1928 and has been enjoyed by 6 generations of Bowmans.
