


2012 Governor's Agricultural Environmental Stewardship Award Criteria/Application Process

The Governor's Agricultural Environmental Stewardship Award is an annual award designed to recognize agricultural producers in five districts of the State that are exceptional environmental stewards. This award recognizes producers that have incorporated conservation practices and best management practices into the day-to-day activities of their farming operations that protect and conserve the natural resources of the state. A five-member selection committee comprised of representatives from each region will select a winner from each of the five regions. A Statewide winner will be selected following a tour of each of the operations selected as regional/district winners. At the Eighth Annual Agriculture Week Kick-Off Festivities that will be held on Tuesday, March 13, 2012, Governor Nathan Deal and Department of Agriculture Commissioner Gary Black will recognize all district winners and announce the State winner.

To be considered for this award, applications <u>must be mailed or electronically submitted</u> to the Center of Innovation for Agribusiness no later than <u>Noon, December 16, 2011</u>.

If you are selected as a District Winner, you will be required to submit a completed and current Nutrient Management Plan and Conservation Plan. You may also submit other supporting materials demonstrating your conservation efforts (photographs, newspaper articles, etc). In addition, you will be asked to submit two letters of recommendation. These letters can be from local government officials, other growers, technical consultants, association representatives, technical service providers that you have worked with or others that are familiar with your operation and conservation efforts. These typed letters should explain the recommender's association with and knowledge of the operation and its conservation successes. <u>Applicants will be notified if they have been selected as a District Winner no later than January 20, 2012</u>. <u>Please mail four copies of the above documentation to the Center of Innovation for Agribusiness at the address below no later than Noon February 3, 2012</u>.

Criteria for selecting winners for the Governor's Agricultural Environmental Stewardship Award

Farmer must be in compliance with all local, state and federal regulations and requirements

Farmer cannot succeed himself in consecutive years as a regional or State winner.

Have the practices implemented on the farm been successful in protecting natural resources in the area? Are the benefits of the implemented practices specific to the site or are their residual benefits to others (i.e. down stream users, neighbors, etc)?

Has the project promoted a coordinated effort between the private landowner and agricultural agencies/organizations?

Applicants will be scored according to following categories:

Environmental Benefits (50%)

What impacts can/are being achieved through this producer's conservation efforts? Has the farmer displayed his or her commitment to protecting and conserving Georgia's natural resources as a long-term goal?

Regulatory verses Voluntary Compliance (10%)

Has the farmer implemented practices on a voluntary basis or because he or she has been mandated through local, state and federal regulations?

Leadership (10%)

Has the producer displayed strong leadership responsibility? How? Has he or she served in any type of position that has proven that he or she is committed to education and outreach with regard to environmental stewardship?

Economic Viability (30%)

Are the conservation practices implemented on the producer's operation promoting the sustainability of an environmentally friendly organization? Are the conservation practices on-going (i.e. still functioning at full potential; on a regular maintenance plan or self sustaining)?
