Fall Festival Fun!





Continued Outreach in Schools

Christi Brantley will continue our outreach mission with several projects this year in District classrooms.

Starting seeds early in milk jugs is a low-maintenance method called winter sowing. It involves placing seeds in milk jugs and leaving them outside to germinate during the winter. The jugs act as mini greenhouses that protect the seeds from the elements and allow them to germinate earlier than direct sowing.







And going to each District to build a jar terrarium with students. It's a great way to spend the colder months when your outdoor garden is dormant. A terrarium is a special type of container garden that forms a decorative display piece in a clear vessel. It is either completely or partially closed and creates and maintains its own unique ecosystem.

Project Updates

We had a great experience with our Butterfly Atrium last year. The excitement and interest from the students and teachers where we were able to take our Caterpillar to Butterfly lessons encouraged us to continue it again this year! We have plans of bigger and better and expanding our lesson to include the benefits of roly-polies!
